

**Bogrim Peulat Shabbat-Jewish Identity (Camp vs. home)**

We will do a spectrum. One end means strongly agree and the other end is strongly disagree. Have campers line up and say these statements:

- I feel more connected to Judaism at camp than at home
- My view on prayer has changed this summer
- My view on Shabbat has changed this summer
- I am more observant at camp than at home
- Camp is a place where it's easier to be Jewish
- Camp focuses too much on Judaism (ex. Prayers, kashrut...)
- I'm comfortable talking about my religion with school friends
- school is a place where I'm comfortable being Jewish
- Jewish singing and dancing should be a focal point of camp
- I'm confident I'll retain my Jewish culture throughout high school
- I connect more to the community Judaism gives me than the actual laws, religious aspects etc..

Next campers stand in a circle and each camper has to act out their favorite aspect of Judaism. (charades)

Final questions:

What are you excited to "bring back" from camp?

We think of camp as a makom kadosh, can you identify the things that make camp a makom kadosh in regards to our Jewish identity?
