Theme: Responsibility/ Achraut

- As an eidah, we ask them what they think responsibility is.
- We give them the dictionary definition. The ability or authority to act or decide on one's own, without supervision
- split them up into 3 groups
- in the groups they will go through 3 different games, and questions before each game
- questions/games:
 - Who is the most responsible person you know, and why?
 - Game – everyone gets 2 cards, yellow and green. Everyone has to close their eyes and then put up the yellow or green card. If they all put up the yellow then everyone gets a candy. If some people put yellow and some green, then no one gets candy. If everyone puts up yellow, but one person puts up green, then the green gets all the candy.
 - Talk about game, and its meaning
 - Do you consider yourself a responsible person, why or why not?
 - Game – strength circle. 1) clap your hand. 2) when you see someone clap their hand, run around the circle. 3) get into a circle and bark. 4) sing happy birthday to the person to the right of you. 5) do jumping jacks. 6) sing eidah song. 7) sit. 8) take a “picture” of someone. 9) do a cartwheel. 10) roll over. 11) start to do rad hayom. 12) say soljalim like a soldier. 13) act like an elephant. 14) do push-ups. 15) shout “the end”
 - Discuss game
 - To what extent do show that you are a responsible person in your life?
 - Game – broken telephone
- come back together.
- Present achraut. Every letter of the word stands for something that relates to responsibility. Example: aleph is ani,
- Rafi can conclude by relating responsibility to the parsha.

sitting, take a "picture"
of someone.

when you see someone
take a "picture" of
someone do a cartwheel.

when you see someone
doing cartwheel
roll over.

⑪

when you see someone
rolls over start to
do "rad-hayom".

⑫

when you hear someone
sings "Rad-Hayom", say:
"Soljalim" (like a soldier)

⑬

when you hear someone
says "Soljalim"
act like an elephant.

⑭

when you see someone
act like an elephant,
do push-ups.

⑮

when you see
someone do push-ups,
shout "the end".
