

Programming Ideas:

① Peulat Tzrif -  
"Tent Bracelet"

purpose: to promote/encourage tent unity through ~~a~~ project that each camper is a part of and to facilitate the process of getting to know each other better.

There ~~are~~ is a different type/color bead for each camper and there must be as many of that bead as there are campers in the tent.

To best complete the Peulah, counselor sets up beads before hand placing ~~a~~ piles of the same kind of bead and forming a circle

The campers are then told to sit down in front of their favorite bead or the one they feel represents them best

Proceed around the circle as each camper shows their bead and explains why they chose it and/or a subsequent story in connection to their bead

ex: I chose yellow because I am always happy and so yellow represents my happiness

By the time you have made it around the circle the campers have learned various things about each other and each

bead serves as a representation of that camper. Pieces of string are passed around and each camper strings their bead on to create the final tent bracelet.

## ⑫ Peulat adah "Mail"

This activity involves the whole edah - preferably one no larger than 90-100. However, the stipulations are that the counselors running/helping w/ the program must have a pretty good idea of all the camper's names. This is also most effective with the two oldest edot at camp and also when done towards the end of the summer. Campers sit in a big circle and are each handed small strips/scrap of paper and a pencil. Counselors explain that they are going to be exchanging notes w/ anyone in the edah and that the counselors are the mailmen. Each round can have a topic such as "write to someone that you want to say sorry about something this session" or "write to someone who you haven't talked to/hung out with all session." That way every
