Hi Josh--

Lake Compounce can accommodate us. We can bring in our own food and they will block off a pavilion for us to eat and station free of charge. The rates are as follows:

100 - 499 people -- \$21.50 (Get one ticket for every 25 tickets purchased)

500+ -- \$20.50

They can accommodate us August 7 or 9. They cannot accommodate us August 6, 8 or 12.

If we'd like to move forward, I would need to make a reservation to make sure she reserves the pavilion for us. Let me know!!

I called Lake Compounce and everything sounds great except the food was a sticking point. She wasn't sure about it so I'm still waiting to hear back from them. She had to discuss with the park manager and said she would get back to me today both about bringing in our own and reserving one of the eating areas. This is the comparison I have started:

Canobie:

** Ticket price -- \$24/per person (published price -- haven't tried to negotiate down yet)

** They allow groups to bring in lunch.

** They have several areas inside the Park for groups to meet and have lunch. They say they won't reserve -- (again, I haven't spoken to them yet.) They are on a first come first served basis. They suggest that you place a chaperone in the area you plan to have lunch when you arrive. This can reserve your space and act as a meeting point for students who become separated from their group.

Lake Compounce

** Ticket price - \$21.50 (Get one ticket for every 25 tickets purchased) May be additional discounts.

** Waiting to hear if we can bring in food

** Closer to camp

I'll try to call the contact again before the end of the day if I don't hear back.

1. **Lake Compounce Theme Park – Bristol, Connecticut:**

Lake Compounce is a ride and splash park with thrill rides and water slides Lake Compounce is located in **Bristol**, Connecticut - about 1 hour 15 minutes from Palmer.
