The size of the

synagogue was very small I do think any more then 75 people would be do large of a group to stay in the synagogue.

Overall I feel that this trip was a great success and really had a lot of growing moments for the edah and for the staff. I was hesitant of wanting a trip but after running it I am in favor of keeping a trip similar to this around. The major issues I saw was keeping the trip on the schedule also the budget of the trip as more campers and prices of things are increasing the budget hasn't changed in the past four years and could really use an increase allowing more opportunities. Also the other major problem that lucky did not effect us is that the majority of the activities and the trip is outside. A rain plan needed to be made and should be solidified as if it had rained we would have been totally lost.
