Intro: 5 minutes

In show business, advertising is everything. Your crew and director know you have the best tzrif in camp- but everyone else doesn't. Your bunks will have esrim dakot to plan a commercial to show the rest of the edah and all of Machane Ramah why your tzrif is the coolest, most fun, exciting and whacky. Each of your tzrifim must use *shalosh milim b'ivrit*. You each must use a special word which we have given your madrichim. The commercial must include a jingle and a popular piece of Ramah choreography. Remember- the script isn't always easy, but you have to make it work. Hurry up, it's SHOwtime!

Planning Time: 25 Minutes

Presentations: 20 minutes

Each bunk must make an "advertisement" to be recorded on video. The ad should explain to the public why their bunk is the best, most fun, enthusiastic, etc. Each bunk must incorporate a word assigned for their bunk in addition to at least 3 hebrew words of their choice.

**Birthday Game:** Each bunk will have to organize themselves by birthday without using words. They may only use hand motions. January 1st at one end and December 31 at the other. For example, If your birthday was March 5, you would first put up a 3 on your fingers for March (the third month) then a 5 for the fifth day of the month.

**Human Knot:** Have the bunk tangle their arms. Each person needs to hold the hands of two different people in the circle who are not standing next to them. They need to untangle their arms so that they are eventually standing in a circle holding hands, The first time they do this they will be allowed to talk while they are untangling but the second time they do this they will need to be silent. This game will assist in showing the importance of speech.

**Tower of Babel:** Each camper is assigned a single word to use, That word is the only word that they can say throughout the activity. As a group, the bunk needs to build the biggest/tallest structure that they can using the materials provided.

Materials: Milk cartons, frisbees, toilet paper rolls, shoes, benches.

Words to assign to individual campers: door, close, yellow, pen, apple, potato, expelliarmus, newb, counterfeit, wood, hair, meh.

**Conclusion:** Conduct a discussion with your group.

What were some of the challenges of not being able to speak to each other? How did you guys compensate for not being able to talk? What was the difference between the speaking and non-speaking activities?
