Groups will line up on the migrash for a relay race with their cars (starting at the swings). Each chanich/a will run to the finish line and back, take off the box and hand it to the next person in line. Groups with fewer people will have to repeat racers.

11:50- 12:50 Peulah 3: Mitzvah Mall (Zev)

- 8 groups: By bunk, each bunk has two groups split by top and bottom bunks
- Each group must come up with a charity that they feel most strongly about and create a poster/proposal about their charity, explaining why people should donate to it. Groups will then get money to donate to the charities they think deserve it the most. Each group must also choose a secretary to take notes during presentations.

What to include on poster: (20-25 minutes)

- Name of charity
- Why this charity is important to them
- What they will do with the money they raise
- Draw a picture to represent their charity

- Each group will then present their proposals to the edah. Each group's secretary will write down notes about each charity, so their group can discuss afterwards where they think their money should go. This means **NO TALKING SHOULD TAKE PLACE DURING PRESENTATIONS**. (5-10 minutes)
- After all groups have made their decisions (5 minutes) they will travel around the mitzvah mall and donate to different charities. (5 minutes)
- At the end, Liav will lead a whole edah discussion (sitting by group) about the importance of giving and making decisions. (5 minutes)
 - Which charities did you donate to? Why?
 - How did you decide which charity to donate to?
 - What is the importance of tzedakah?
 - What did you get out of this activity?

Here is some more information about tzedakah...

When translated into English, the root "tzedakah" means charity -- giving to those in need.

Tzedakah is part of the 10 Commandments and holds a very high place in Judaism. Tzedakah is derived from the Hebrew word tzade-dalet-qof, meaning righteous, fair, or just.

Can anyone name any of the 8 levels of tzedakah?

They are as follows:

- 1) Giving begrudgingly
- 2) Giving less than you should, but giving cheerfully
- 3) Giving after being asked
- 4) Giving before being asked
- 5) Giving when you are unaware of the recipient's identity, but the recipient is aware of yours
- 6) Giving when you are aware of the recipient's identity, yet you remain anonymous
- 7) Giving when neither party is aware of the other's identity
- 8) Enabling the recipient to become self reliant

- Each group will then find out that the money they made from their charities will be able to be used for the Chinese auction. **Madrachim should collect all money from chanichim for later!!**

Charity Options:
