To elevate the Palmer overnight experience, we deliver quality programs to excite and engage our campers and provide the support they need to succeed. We hire and train top-notch staff members who become the indispensable role models for our children.

Elevating our Daily Program

- **Sports Instruction**: Professional coaching, plus instruction for older campers through our sports team program
- Visual Arts: High level skill-building in a wide variety of techniques and media
- **Swim Instruction and Boating**: Younger campers polish their swim skills with experienced swim instructors and everyone loves boating on the *Agam* (lake)
- **Shabbat**: At the end of each busy week, our community revels in the community spirit of *Shabbat*, a central part of the Ramah experience.

Elevating Our Specialty Camp Within Our Camp

Kishroniyah (from the Hebrew word for talent) allows older campers to concentrate on chosen areas of interest with visiting professional instructors. In addition to mini-camps in sports and the visual arts, in 2019 participants developed their talents in workshops that ranged from Robotics and Steampunkinetics to A Capella and Dance, from Circus Workshop and Cooking to Filmmaking and Lifeguard Training.

Elevating Our Community

In *kayitz* 2019, we elevated our entire community by strengthening our relationships with one another and with God and Israel:

- Elevating Our Connection to Truth: Through our summer learning theme *Emet*, campers probed what Judaism has to say about truth and honesty. We challenged ourselves with these questions: Why is truth important? How do we remain true to our values? Can there be competing narratives that are both true?
- Elevating Our Interpersonal Relationships: Staff members and older campers attended workshops with Lindsay Fram, a noted sex educator, to heighten their understanding of genuine consent in personal relationships and to consider real-life scenarios that might arise.
- Elevating our Connection to Prayer: Our rabbis and educators worked closely with our *edah* staff to increase campers' knowledge of and engagement with *t'fillot*. Visiting specialists, including master songleader Rabbi Josh Warshawsky, enlived our *t'fillot* and *shira* (singing).
- Elevating Our Connection to Israel: We sought to foster deeper knowledge of Israel its people, its land and its story. On *Yom Yisrael* (Israel Day), we celebrated the diversity within the State of Israel and explored our personal connections to Israel.

Elevating Our Connection to Nature

In just two summers, our *Pinat Teva* (Nature Corner) has become one of the most beloved parts of camp. Our campers are learning to take care of animals. (Sheep and goats and ducks and chickens — oh my!) The new garden, which quickly became green with vegetables, herbs and flowers, has become a place of learning and wonder. Our expanded outdoor cooking area — now outfitted with fire pits and a pizza oven — provides more opportunities to cook and use the plants we have nurtured. Through this outdoor education center, our community has deepened its commitment to environmental stewardship and appreciation of our natural world.







Elevating Our Staff Leaders

Each summer, we strive to provide our young staff members from North America and Israel the tools they need to provide superb care to our campers and become exceptional role models. Because alumni studies show that the Ramah staff experience leads to stronger Jewish engagement in adulthood, we give staff members powerful Jewish experiences and skills that they can use in other settings, such as conflict resolution, team-building and problem-solving.

In 2019, our revamped staffing model gave in-bunk staff more opportunities to collaborate as a team. These *madrichim chevratim* now attend daily staff training sessions with Rabbi Gelb and other senior staff. They have heightened responsibility for campers within their bunks and for programs planned for the entire *edah* (unit). Our Staff Support Specialist helped staff members meet challenges in their work.



Elevating Our Camper Leaders

Through our leadership training programs, older campers learn to become role models that our younger campers emulate. Campers in *Nivonim* (rising 11th graders) participate in a summerlong leadership training program in which they have increasing responsibilities for campers in our *Amitzim* (*Tikvah*) and younger *edot*. This year, this program culminated in *Yom Gesher* (Bridge Day), in which they rose to a new level of responsibility by caring for these campers for a full day. They also continued the *Nivonim* tradition of leading *shira* every *Shabbat* and running *Yom Sport* with great *ruach*.

Campers in *Machon* (rising 10th graders) took on significant roles with *Amitzim* during sports activities and performed together in *Frozen*, a high point of the summer.

Elevating Hebrew

Sha'ar, the day camp's highly popular Hebrew language immersion program, continues to grow. The 40 campers who participated in 2019 gained proficiency by speaking only Hebrew to their counselors and engaging in hand-on activities that contextualized the Hebrew that they were hearing and speaking throughout the day.





Elevating Inclusion

The *Tikvah* Program opened in 2019 to enable campers with learning, social and developmental differences to have fun — and to thrive. Sixteen campers formally participated in the program or were informally supported by our *Tikvah* Director. In the new *Cheder Menucha* (Sensory Room), campers had an opportunity to take a break and recharge.

Tikvah Program

The Tikvah Program in Palmer continues to be the premier Jewish camp program for children, teens and young adults with disabilities. The program provides an inclusive, accepting and nurturing environment for learning, socialization, and immersive Jewish living.

Each summer is an opportunity for young people of all abilities to share in the magic of camp — to sing, swim, dance, play, work, celebrate Shabbat together, learn from each other, and create new friendships.

As Tikvah celebrates its fiftieth anniversary, it continues to grow and evolve as it strives to serve campers with a wide range of learning, social, and developmental differences. The two-week Mini-Amitzim track provides younger campers with a great introduction to camp. The Ma'avar track, a highly supported transitional vocational program for young adults, ensures that our programs are tailored to individual needs. More job coaches and new training sites ensure that adults can develop a broad range of skills that can be transferred to a variety of settings, with an emphasis on the food service and hospitality industries.











Under the Tikvah Umbrella

75 participants succeed at camp because of these programs:

- Inclusion support and accommodations for campers who can live in typical bunks
- Mini-Amitzim and Amitzim (campers ages 10 through teens who benefit from a higher level of support)
- *Ma'avar* and *Tochnit Avodah* (young adults who participate in vocational training)

Facility Improvements

Working closely with synagogues and schools, Ramah engages hundreds of children and their families through programs at our sites in Palmer, MA and Germantown, MD and at synagogues and schools throughout our region. The reimagined *Shabbat* is Awesome program, for example, brings day-long experiential Ramah programs to our partner communities.

Year-round experiences at synagogues in the Boston area and in Providence are supported by *Gesher* Ramah, a program of the National Ramah Commission supported by generous funding from the AVI CHAI Foundation.


